Hebrews 12

Running without purpose is not that enjoyable. However, running with a purpose whether that be exercise, competition, or safety is a different story. Although painstaking and difficult at times, running with a purpose always results in a reward. That makes the effort of running worth it. But you've got to finish to receive the reward. The author of Hebrews compares our faith journey to running a race and encourages us to run to finish so that we may receive our reward!

I. You're in the race whether you like it or not! vv. 1-4

II. Run to Finish! (4 reasons we quit running and the antidotes that will keep us running to the finish)

- 1. Distraction:** We lose focus. (v. 2) Antidote: Fix your eyes on Jesus.
- 2. Hardship:** We get discouraged. (vv. 3-12) Antidote: Endure hardship as discipline.
- 3. Conflict & Impurity:** We let sin rule us. (vv. 13-17) Antidote: Pursue peace and purity.
- 4. Fear:** We resent or run from God (vv. 18-29) Antidote: Embrace God's gospel voice!

Ask yourself, "Does it help me run!"
